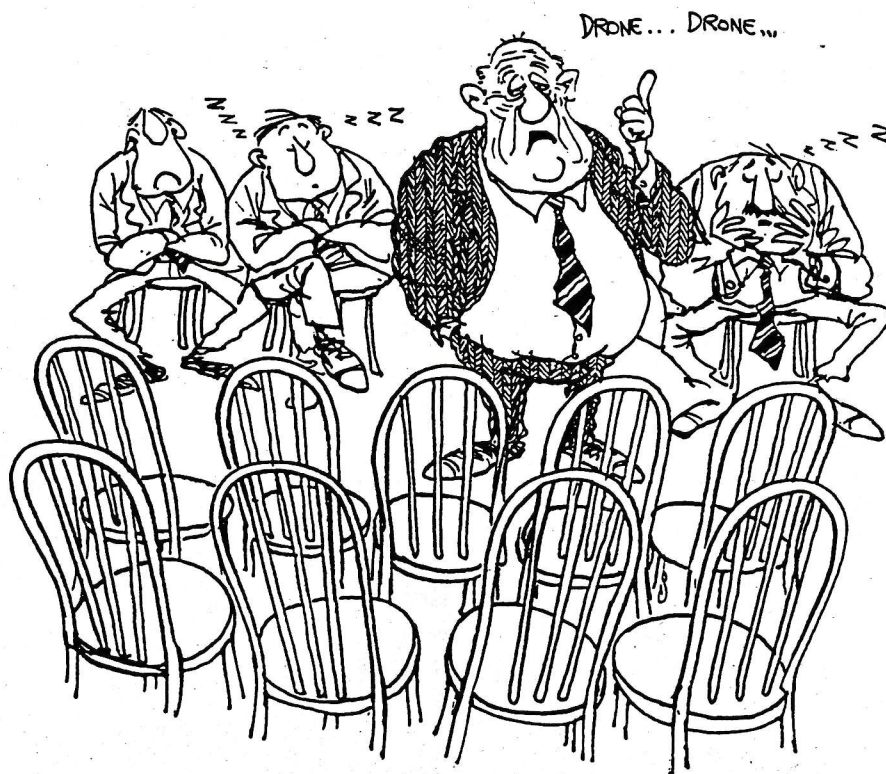
Just a reminder that the annual general meeting of Hillgrove will be held on Monday, the 1st of May at 7:30 pm at the St. Kilda Hotel.

Blue Monday recalls that following a few celebratory drinks after cricket Herbie Edgar, Keith Morgan, D.Dye and himself left the ground. Whilst travelling through Sewell territory all gates were left open. All hell broke loose!!

One final, in days gone past, Hillgrove were playing Austin College in a 30 over-a-side one dayer. The chaps were decidedly happy after dismissing Austin for a meagre 71 runs. After being 1 for 19, a Mr Buckland took a handy 8 for 9 to dismiss a decidedly gloomy Hillgrove for 32. This led to the signing up of several of the Austin players to Hillgrove. Joe Sewell was undecided whether it was our batting or bowling that impressed them.

However the most fascinating fact was that it all started with a carved wooden bat and a tennis ball just after the war. In the semi, we played UNE where a combination of dropped catches, not bowling straight enough and our batsman not batting enough overs concluded in the competition.

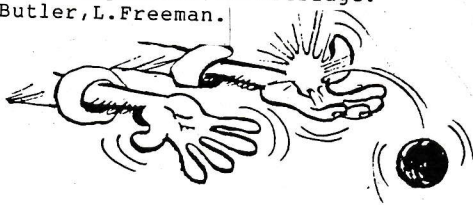

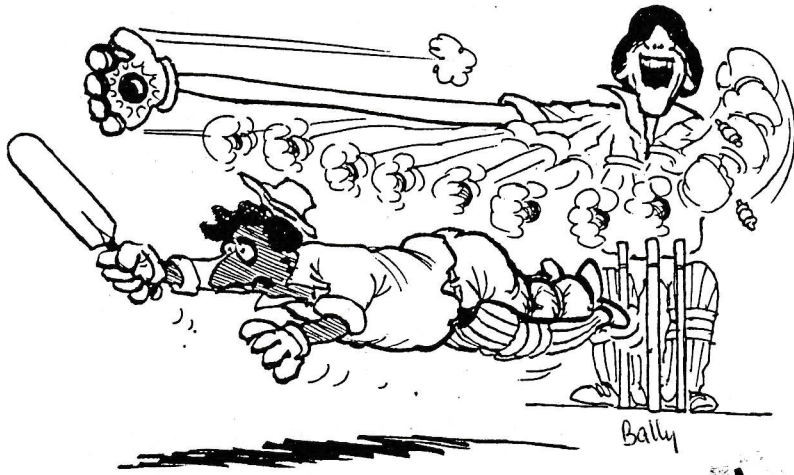
3RD GRADE REPORT
